Prologue

Should we be worried about the current political disorder, endless conflicts and wars? Should we blindly believe everything the media reports, whose goal is to sell bad news by nurturing fear? Or should we believe that the extraordinary progress of science will save humanity from imminent disaster? Was there ever a time, in the brief history of humanity, when our ancestors lived in peace and harmony?

We can imagine that such a time existed. Imagination can take us to the farthest galaxies, the most exquisite paradises, the nirvanas of permanent happiness, and the most attractive Eden. But can imagination create reality, or can it only fancy the imaginable? Can we change the world by imagining ideals?

Imagining is fleeing from *what-is*, escaping from reality. When the facts don't meet our expectations, we suffer frustration or anger. Then we live in a state of constant conflict when we cannot adequately respond to every provocation, event, or incident. By adding a personal judgment to the unexpected provocations, we fuel the fire of conflict between what-is and what-should-be.

Good news does not enrich the media barons. They know that much can be obtained from those who are fearful or anxious. They employ experts in manipulation, marketing, and advertising to feed and maintain anxiety, with very specific goals in mind. Fear is a destructive emotion, difficult to control, and rarely questioned.

Faced with the political nonsense that sustains nationalism and vast administrative bureaucracies that draw a lot of tax money but produce little, one can realise their impact on the economy and general well-being. Some citizens express their revolt, others take to the barricades, and many turn their backs. Can we observe the facts without expressing irritation, anger, revolt, or indifference?

Chaos seems to be growing in the economic and monetary sphere, a consequence of political decisions based on the interests of the strongest and richest. What is really happening? Are we doomed, or can we believe that chaos will lead to a reassessment, a great clean-up, and a springboard to a new, wiser humanity?

We can identify three fundamental elements that underpin the foundations of current humanity and have therefore fuelled the problems we are facing today:

- 1-The awakening and growth of the individual ego over the last two millennia.
- 2-The concentration of the world economy on oil and all its derivatives since the beginning of the 20th century.
- 3-The illusion of socialism and its consequences.

Before seeking to know in which direction we are traveling, it is essential to know where we are coming from. Instead of focusing all our attention and energy on the tangible effects of a crisis, we must first access the 'big picture' and understand the causes of the current disorder and imbalance.

Few are the politicians (and the ultra-rich) who don't aspire to absolute power over people. This is not new! In the past, pharaohs, kings, emperors, or tsars, popes, princes along with those who supported them, used force, brutality, cruelty, and injustice to keep people submissive and passive. But history clearly shows that human beings cannot be enslaved forever. The individual possesses an innate strength of resistance and opposition capable of overthrowing all injustices as long as people are united in the struggle against manipulation, growing dictatorship and injustice.

Past revolutions have changed very little in the individual psyche. The movements of revolt against abusive systems have helped change apparent structures but without transforming individual psychology.

The only true revolution is the one capable of transforming each individual. Changing systems only tinges the background with a different colour. We can move from monarchies to republics, or from empires to communism, but no new system has been able to eradicate pride, selfishness, greed, ignorance, indifference, two-facedness, etc.

'The awakening of Homo Galactica' offers a major transformation that can be realised through the growth of individual consciousness. All the sages of all times have pointed out that to change the world, there is only one option: to know oneself to the depths of the conscious and unconscious, to recognize without condemning what is within us, especially what we hide from ourselves, what we deny and do not want to see.

There is a proper time to express discontent, and to upset the status quo. These actions have their role and are necessary to rid ourselves of the tyranny of gigantic egos seeking to shape the world for their own interest. But it is crucial to understand that it is impossible to change others, and we can only act on ourselves. Certainly, it is easy to blame the authorities, but did we not choose these authorities by our conscious actions or by our indifference? As a philosopher once said, "We are the world, and it will only change when we change our perceptions."

We are shaped by our genetic baggage but also by the environment in which we grew up. Then, in turn, we shape the environment and maintain traditions. True action (the 'non-action' of Lao Tzu) does not come from thought activities, nor from the known or the experienced. It is a sudden, unexpected, surprising, immediate, and spontaneous event.

There are those who question life and death, pleasure and suffering, and the environment in which they live. Then there are those who do not want their opinions, traditions, perceptions, and habits to be disturbed.

What matters are their distractions and the pursuit of lasting pleasure here or elsewhere.

This essay is for those who are curious and ready to abandon everything they know to embark on a journey of discovery, without following any authority, teacher, or past scenario.

We mentioned above three major influences that have inspired the mental and physical development of our ancestors. Their ramifications and consequences have contributed to shaping current humanity.

A-The mental and cultural element:

The West was awakened two thousand years ago by Jesus, whose teachings are the foundation of the development of Western culture. In short, his teachings are at the origin of the liberation of the individual ego, which had revolutionary consequences for the world.

B. The material element:

At the beginning of the 21st century, a few major American financiers chose oil for future technological development. Eager to make huge fortune from a single product, they funded scientific research exclusively based on 'black gold' at a time when scientists could have developed free energy. Tesla was side-lined, and oil became black gold! Scientific experts then directed all their efforts to develop, invent, and create consumer products primarily designed from oil.

Oil monopolises the world economy at the expense of natural, non-polluting products favourable to the environment and health.

- * Transport: energy (gasoline, diesel, gas)
- * Packaging: plastics,
- * Textiles: nylon, etc.
- * Agriculture: fertilizers, herbicides, pesticides, fungicides...
- * Medicine: pharmaceuticals
- * Food: preservatives, colourings, flavours, taste enhancers, etc.

C. The political element:

The political landscape of the last three millennia was disrupted by endless violent wars and revolutions. Various systems of government were established: monarchies, empires, republics, absolutism, dictatorships of the right or left, communism, and socialism, etc. This last system promised justice, equality, and fraternity, but its implementation gradually transformed to primarily serve the interests of the powerful, the ultra-rich, or a bourgeois class.

How and when did the individual ego appear?

Why did Christianity succeed in establishing itself in Europe and then on other continents? How did it manage to supplant previous religions? You may be given multiple reasons for its success, which has lasted for two millennia, but the primary reason for its influence on Western culture is that it was the first religious movement to offer hope of empowerment to the servile classes, the slaves, the poor, and the oppressed. In short, Jesus' teaching was the first to separate the 'individual self' from the 'collective self,' the first to offer hope of a better afterlife for the masses suffering from slavery, poverty, and class injustices!

Let's go back in history for a short journey.

Great civilizations were all established by a succession of stages ultimately imposing the power of an aristocracy of the sword. To better secure these powerful warriors and their power, some 'priests' established beliefs in another life, of course favouring the aristocracy and the clergy.

In brief, the foundation of this state can be summed up in a few words: "As in heaven, so on earth." This means that the king, emperor, or pharaoh were assured of being king, emperor, or pharaoh in heaven, while the worker, peasant, serf, or slave were condemned to the same condition in the kingdom of the gods. The destitute, the poor, or the slaves had no hope of a better life. Thus, the status of classes was established once and for all, and for eternity.

It should also be considered that the consciousness of an individual ego was practically non-existent before Christ. Only the authorities could claim having an 'individual self.' The communal ego can still be found among certain peoples today. The Chinese, for instance, exhibit impulsive group reactions that no longer exist among Westerners. We had the opportunity to observe the totally opposite reactions of Europeans and Asians at the tip of the Cape of Good Hope. A large baboon was trying to steal food from some visitors. The Westerners fled in different directions. When the big ape approached a group of about ten Chinese, they instinctively and immediately grouped together into a block.

The prophet from Nazareth disrupted the status quo with his words: "In my Father's kingdom, the first will be last, and the last will be first!" The reactions were not immediate. It took some time for the masses to

discover the significance of this message, and for the authorities to realize the consequences. Jesus' message transformed suffering and submissive humanity into a volcano that suddenly gained the hope and potential to overturn everything...

It is therefore not surprising that Jesus' teachings were considered dangerous for the dominant classes of the Roman Empire. The persecution of Christians should be seen as a reaction by Roman power against the liberation struggle of the subjugated classes. Later, this extraordinary energy was skilfully channelled by ecclesiastical authorities to justify the Crusades, colonisation, and the expansion of Western civilisation across the planet.

The liberation of the individual ego had profound consequences. On the one hand, converts easily became fanatics, encouraged by the belief that they would receive eternal rewards in a paradise of joy, happiness, and pleasure. Dying for 'God' meant obtaining compensation for a life of submission and suffering on earth. The individual ego was liberated in most European countries by Christian 'missionaries'. The roots of Western civilization lie in this belief of eternal rewards. In short, the stronger the belief, the more capable the individual became of fighting to achieve goals set by religious leaders. The Crusades are a famous example. If we analyse most conflicts and wars of the last two millennia, as well as the great discoveries and expansion of European powers towards Asia, the Americas, Africa, it becomes clear that they were made possible by the enthusiasm of individuals convinced they would receive eternal prizes for their devotion. Catholic authorities became powerful 'heads of state,' and allied with the aristocracy of sword and guns to dominate the world.

The foundations of the Western civilization are therefore rooted in the awakening of the individual ego.

In other words, "Every man for himself, and God for all"

*How will science and metaphysics converge to offer a novel answer to the mystery of life?

*What is the revolutionary and prodigious paradigm shift that has been stealthily infiltrating since the beginning of the Aquarian era?

This book does not claim to teach you anything but to offer you different perspectives on your life. Once you have opened these new doors, Life itself will begin a subtle yet astonishing transformation, a fundamental revolution.

Uncertain Times

A worldwide survey conducted by Gallup at the end of 2006 for the World Economic Forum in Davos revealed a global discontent with the political authorities in the vast majority of countries around the globe. The conclusions clearly established that most leaders abuse their powers and are incapable of improving the fate of humanity.

Extremely revealing figures that reflect the views of 1.5 billion people and demonstrate that the current 'democratic' system is cracking on all sides due to the continued dishonesty of politicians.

Aside from African countries where the trickery of leaders is legendary, many citizens in European countries considered their leaders dishonest (76% in Austria, 69% in Germany, 54% in Belgium, and 52% in the United States).

Despite the extraordinary feats of science and the comfort offered by technology, it seems that a great malaise has been overwhelming the planet since the beginning of the 21st century.

In Europe, political systems are being increasingly doubted and criticised violently. 'Socialist democracy' no longer seems to be a fair system for those who work and pay taxes. Regular riots demonstrate growing discontent. Socialism sought to create a fairer society in Europe,

but it primarily benefited the ultra-rich, who pay little tax compared to the middle class. As for the masses, they live on meagre wages and often do not want to work more for fear of being 'massacred' by the tax authorities. Taxpayers and entrepreneurs are overwhelmed by taxes to pay for the free social benefits offered to those who vote.

In wanting to give and distribute to those who have little and those who cannot find work (or do not want to work), socialism has fostered a decadent society. But did it not do so mainly to obtain the votes of the masses? It sowed the seeds of its own downfall by believing that penalizing those who undertake and work helps to create a fairer society. A beautiful illusion of pencil pushers thirsty for privileges! True yin/yang and a pendulum swing: in wanting equality, one only pushes inequality behind the scenes. It always comes back in force, just as Christianity struggled for 2,000 years to create a humanity of love by believing that hatred would disappear through desire, prayers and goodwill! Jesus liberated the individual ego, but that ego is the ultimate barrier against Love!

The intention is undoubtedly the only positive aspect in all the systems of government applied on the planet. But intention guided by thought has always led to disintegration. Politicians will always be the main beneficiaries of these systems. The masses are too often blinded by their promises. Ego demands it. It is the politicians and their armies of administrators, bureaucrats, lawyers, and bodyguards who are the first to consume the taxes paid by entrepreneurs and workers.

Politicians don't create jobs. At best, they could ensure a favourable climate for entrepreneurs. But what choices do we, individuals of the Aquarian era, have to avoid the money wasted by politics? Create yet another system? How many systems of government have existed and created more confusion and injustice? Authoritarianism, totalitarianism, autocracy, absolutism, despotism, oligarchy, anarcho-capitalism, anarcho-socialism, anarcho-communism, Marxism, emirate, eco-anarchism, absolute monarchy, constitutional or elective monarchy, duchy, patriarchy, democracy (in all its forms), sociocracy, federal state, capitalism, thugocracy (criminal networks), synarchy (Andorra), meritocracy, panarchy, phallocracy, pornocracy (influence of courtesans), etc.

****Is it necessary to create new systems of government after all this nonsense? Let's think for a moment: won't there always be big egos, smooth talkers in search of power under any form of government, eager**

for influence, for wealth, and privileges? Applying a remedy against the effects never cures the cause!

The problem is not the systems of government but the way power is given to unscrupulous opportunists. Changing systems will lead nowhere! What remains then but the need for a deep change at the individual level, the awakening of a more acute consciousness?

Some facts:

****Eighty percent of Westerners fear loneliness more than the plague. What would most people do without their televisions, radios, cell phones, distractions, or pills? A growing malaise envelops humanity with its cloak of darkness. But why this malaise? What is it related to?**

****Towards the end of the 20th century, in Europe and Quebec, a significant number of places of worship, convents, and seminaries closed their doors due to a lack of clergy and disciples. Seminaries, abbeys, and convents emptied at a dizzying pace. It took only a few decades for vocations to suddenly dry up. Meanwhile, Africa discovered the Love of Christ and sent its priests to officiate in European churches.**

On the other hand, religious fundamentalism has strongly reinforced itself in the United States and in predominantly Muslim countries. Why do some individuals desperately cling to their dogmas while many others have abruptly turned their backs on them?

****China and India entered in a phase of growth that will have significant consequences on the globe; the conflicts in the Middle East were partially resolved by impoverishing Israel's direct neighbours but a new conflict has appeared. Several financial crises and the intervention of central banks with dubious consequences have brought the demon of inflation to the surface; other evils could suddenly emerge from the gargantuan structures of greed and the monopolization of wealth. All of this will contribute to creating different circumstances that will have a major impact on the coming decades. We are undeniably living in a significant period of transition.**

Finally, scientists studying global warming predict that its impact could reduce global growth if governments continue to procrastinate instead of undertaking drastic measures. Could this 'pivotal' time be related to the transition from the Age of Pisces to the Age of Aquarius?

****For today's adolescent, the Age of Pisces seems like prehistory. Indeed, they might ask, how could one live without calculators, television, memory cards, the internet, mobile phones, computers, GPS, and artificial**

intelligence? These modern 'tools' have only appeared in the last five decades, at the very beginning of the Age of Aquarius. Their widespread adoption across the planet also signals a radical and abrupt change in how humanity will transition into the coming centuries.

**On the other hand, while in the Age of Pisces (and previous ages), humans accepted determinism and the control of temporal and spiritual powers to guide their steps, now they have lost more and more confidence in many of their authorities. Certain reference points and values dear to their ancestors have vanished, and nothing replaces them. They then throw themselves into the dependency of materialism and consumerism. However, life quickly reminds them that consuming or possessing more and more goods does not satisfy their desire for eternal life.

Will we see an entire humanity obsessed with materialism and denying the supernatural? Charles d'Yderwalle wrote in 1950:

'The Westerners have resolved the question of the supernatural by denying it or, more precisely, by not thinking about it, by relegating it to an Unknowable they no longer care about. They who know so much! One would think that death, for many Westerners, is just an inexorable chemical phenomenon, caused by old age or illness.'

**Have the educated persons, transitioning to the Aquarius Age, driven out their gods by rejecting superstition? Could they get rid of the authority of their conditioning and desires in one fell swoop, believing they have discovered almost all the mysteries of nature?

Some believe so, while others throw themselves wholeheartedly into new religions (or old ones that have modernized to be more attractive), believing they will cure them of their malaise. But deep down, humans may fear illness, loneliness, old age, or death more than their ancestors.

'What is the meaning of my life?' they ask themselves. 'Am I an insignificant link in the chain of evolution? An accident of nature?'

**When they are young, sexual demand, the desire to reproduce, and build a family structure takes up a large part of people energy and time. The other part is dedicated to studying, to climb the ladder of privileges or working hard to acquire the ladder and the privileges. They hardly have time to think about what their true nature and destiny are.

**Jesus proclaimed a revolutionary system of valorisation in which the subjugated people of the West believed for two thousand years. After some initial resistance, the temporal aristocracies adopted the Christian concepts and joined the spiritual power to gorge themselves on the naivety of the flock. But the mass education of the last centuries

encouraged the individual to question, denigrate, and revolt against the supreme social injustices they inherited. They discovered that they could demand recognition of their fundamental rights to valorisation during their existence. They decided to no longer wait for an Afterlife.

Since then, the Church authorities offers them the love of Christ instead of the severity of an implacable Father. And the wealthy and powerful have offered them democracy. They changed their powdered wigs of worldly princes to become discreet 'eminences', or barons of high finance, controlling the media, businesses and politics. The masses believed they were out of the muck. They did not realize that the stinking manure of yesteryear had simply been transformed into a heap of odourless filth.

The 'God and my right' of the past was simply replaced by 'My money and my right,' because, in all so-called democratic societies, the more money one has, the more rights one has. The democratic principle allowed a fundamentally bourgeois elite to receive the privileges once reserved for aristocrats.

But depression is still there! And, paradoxically, it is as prevalent, if not more so, among the rich as it is among the poor!

****Gradually, the sensible human realises that having money and power is not enough to answer the ultimate question "What is the meaning of life?"**

The only true equality remains that which forces every individual to humility in the face of suffering and death. For nothing distinguishes the corpse of a rich man from that of a poor man, except that vermin often enjoy a longer feast on the rich man's body.

Yes, humanity is now undergoing a profound transformation. Everything around us is changing: moral values, cultures, technology, science, as well as our understanding of the cosmos, the infinitely small, and the infinitely large. Even the laws of nature, once believed to be immutable, are being questioned.

A wind of transformation is sweeping through human society, more vigorously than the scientific revolution of the 17th century initiated by Copernicus's discoveries. Could it be that the wind of change heralding the Age of Aquarius might transform the individual's conception of themselves, their role in society, and their purpose in life?

Many desperately cling to their habits and achievements. Resistance to transformation rears its hydra head at every corner of the globe. However, these resistances are necessary evils because the stronger the resistance, the more quickly change will occur.

We resist the winds of change in various ways. Many are caught up in a vortex of consumption, spend recklessly, believing it offers them respite from their malaise. Some turn to body worship and the hope of eternal

youth, enriching the cosmetic and 'beauty' industries. Others plunge into extreme religious fundamentalism, clashing head-on with other fundamentalists. Finally, pornography and drugs offer brief moments of illusory ecstasy to millions trying to escape boredom and others plunged into the darkness of poverty, lack of recognition, or insecurity.

It seems that a part of humanity is rushing toward a feast of the senses, a 'last supper before the end,' as if they intuitively sense that an imminent revolution will sweep everything away.

Current events predict the signs of considerable trials to come, but we place blind trust in human ingenuity and technology. The prophets of doom may be a necessary evil, given that 80% of our contemporaries need fear to act and change. Haven't they already demonstrated this by rushing to get a never-tested 'vaccine'?

With the advent of the 21st century, Earth bears the heavy legacy of the abuses committed by the not-so-wise homo sapiens of the last two millennia. But it also counts a certain number of optimistic and conscious forerunners, beings who are already shedding the characteristic traits of the previous era and are on the path to metamorphosis.

Each at their own pace, they are quietly entering the chrysalis of metamorphosis that will carry humankind, over nearly two thousand years, into the Age of Aquarius and towards the awakening of Homo Galactica.

Metamorphosis is a slow process. For the caterpillar, rapid metamorphosis is out of the question, and the process won't begin until it is ready. The same is true for human beings. A growing number are slowly moving toward the transformation heralded by the Age of Aquarius. But humanity is still mostly made up of beings skilled with their hands or brains, who belong fully to the Age of Pisces, behaving according to the typical traits of that age. 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Chapter I: Opening Doors

"It is very difficult not to fall into the almost universal tendency to treat our knowledge as a set of practically fixed truths, rather than as the essence of a process." - D. Bohm

Who am I? Why am I on this planet? What is the purpose of my existence? Will science ever hold the key to understanding life, death, and the universe? Is death total annihilation or the beginning (or continuation) of something else?

These are the fundamental questions asked by those who are curious. Their intuition whispers that we are part of a majestic spectacle, and their curiosity probes what might lie behind the curtain of the Universe. One cannot be fully human without seeking to understand the mystery of life by striving to know oneself. Giving up, refusing to think about it, or blindly accepting the explanations of scholars, prophets, or religious authorities fossilizes our roots and shortens our wings.

The optimal use of the brain and of intellectual, spiritual, and emotional quotients reveals our degree of evolution between Homo Habilis and Homo Sapiens.

What does **anthropology** say?

This science has discovered many things since Darwin. Australopithecus branched off from the primate lineage several million years ago. Anthropology tells us that Habilis became Erectus and then Sapiens after hundreds of thousands of years.

* Homo Erectus lived in Africa 300 to 400,000 years before our era.

* Neanderthal lived in Europe 100,000 years ago. He mastered fire but did not know how to start it or keep it.

* Cro-Magnon disappeared from Europe (and the planet) about 35,000 years ago. He knew how to start and maintain fire and cooked his food. He was succeeded by various waves of Homo Sapiens.

NB: Sapiens means wise, intelligent...

Today, in our pedantry, we claim to belong to a more sophisticated species: that of Homo Sapiens-sapiens (in other words, "Super Wise"), which supposedly succeeded Cro-Magnon.

In Europe, Homo Sapiens supplanted Neanderthal in a cultural explosion that had its origins in Africa. Professor R. Klein of Stanford University believes that a genetic mutation occurred in the neurological functioning of the brain about 50,000 years ago. He suggests that this mutation suddenly gave our ancestors a new power of innovation. Symbolic thinking and language appeared, offering a significant advantage over other hominids who did not benefit from this mutation.

However, it is not yet proven that symbolic thinking did not appear earlier than 40,000 years ago or that it was not the result of a long process. Some discoveries exhibit objects and tools dating back as far as 500,000 years (stone knives from Lake Baringo in Kenya), 80,000 years (barbed harpoons from Katanda in Congo), and 75,000 years (shells for necklaces at Blombos in Cape). Some of our ancestors may have already mastered symbolic thinking long before the genetic mutation proposed by Professor Klein, 50,000 years ago.

**We seem to be the modern version of that rough and hairy ancestor, the one who managed to separate from other animal species on planet Earth. But also, the one that claims to have double wisdom and intelligence, despite having exterminated, within a century, an astounding number of individuals of its own species, and millions of animals and plants species that formed the delicate ecological balance of its planet. Beautiful wisdom of Sapiens indeed!

**The term "Homo double Sapiens" is certainly not an absolute label to stick on every individual of the last millennia. We all have tendencies, the main one currently being that of Homo Sapiens, but we are also Homo Erectus and Homo Habilis (many have this latter aptitude as their dominant trait). It is impossible for us to lose a faculty. We only accumulate them. They are part of our "makeup." For example, all Sapiens are Erectus but also Habilis (tamed, socialized skilful). The human species move slowly toward a form of being of which we can never have a precise

idea, but whose potential is unlimited. It will never be a straight path. It is a difficult path, a laborious evolution that will never end, except by the end of the support of life for our species, its planet, or the galaxy.

Let's return to our hairy ancestors.

Modern man certainly didn't fall onto the planet's soil from a lost Paradise, stripped of his hominid hair to better punish him for 'original sin' through the cold! ... except, of course, for those who believe in fairy tales. The hominid has certainly evolved in leaps over the course of 7 million years of its existence.

**Experts have classified hominids based on the evolution of anatomical characteristics, according to the parts of skeletons discovered. The logical progression of hominid evolution is therefore the one mentioned above: the skilful hominid (with his hands) whose posture becomes upright and then acquires a certain 'intelligence'. All this is well known to students of natural science.

However, this classification presents some difficulties for those who have noticed the presence of very limited wisdom among a large number of individuals.

It is correct to qualify as "Homo Habilis" the species that, over millennia, saw its intellectual quotient increase from mastering fire, making flint tools, developing language skills, and achieving sophisticated accomplishments such as the wheel, ancient temples, pyramids, and cathedrals, and finally the inventions of the industrial age and the technological revolution.

This human has certainly become more and more skilful, but not necessarily wiser, since he has caused immense disasters along the way with his ability to make increasingly deadly weapons and increasingly polluting industries.

So, not all skilled hominids would have transformed into Sapiens after discovering the use of flint and the wheel? The criterion of the modern Sapiens-Sapiens is primarily the harmonious combination of dexterity, control of symbolic thought, social responsibility, and emotional balance. If Erectus-Habilis primarily developed his handiness, the modern Sapiens has understood that only the balanced mix of the three quotients IQ, EQ, and SQ* would make him free from his genetic impulses.

** Intellectual, Emotional, Spiritual

**Let us rather seek the source of the disparity in tendencies present in each individual. We have all inherited the Erectus tendency. If you disagree, try walking like a chimpanzee down the main street of your town and don't be surprised if your mother finds you in a zoo or a psychiatric hospital!

The Habilis tendency is at the origin of technological prowess, but it has also enabled us to wage war and shamelessly exploit our planet. The Sapiens-Sapiens knows how to make peace, abolish slavery, state human rights, formulate slogans like 'Equality, Fraternity, Liberty,' or balance social order by applying fundamental spiritual values of altruistic philosophies.

Every modern human thus possesses all these tendencies, but their combination, or the percentage of their presence, varies greatly from one individual to another. You probably know people who demonstrate a strong Habilis tendency and a weak Sapiens tendency? If not, turn on your television, and you'll find an alarming number.

If the human race still exists in two million years, and if it continues to evolve as it has so far, it will consist of individuals possessing a great number of new tendencies of which we have no idea today. As for trying to know what they will be, it is as futile as trying to guess God's age.

The modern Sapiens-Sapiens is deeply rooted in his village, his city, his country, and his planet. His identity merges with that of the society in which he lives. His priority is to ensure social order because, for him, without social order, there is neither peace nor progress. He is the source of great civilizations, religious movements, social revolutions. He has shaped various societies and then gradually sought to shape a great human society through globalization.

His work is of major importance in the development of a wiser humanity. It is all the more so because he has never ceased to clash with those 'Habilis' who are poor Sapiens and who haunt the world. The great conflicts bear witness to this. The modern Sapiens-Sapiens has sought to balance the instincts or impulses of the individual, to channel them, to socialize them, to humanize them. The great Sages and prophets have had a major influence but a tremendous amount of work remains to be done because the Sapiens-Sapiens does not control the pure Habilis who plays with war or polluting industries and constantly put the future of the species at risk.

Unfortunately, the present history is only a mad race of Habilis driven by excessive profits, an insatiable consumption, and multiple conflicts between wealthy materialists and poor fundamentalists.

****Unlike traditional Eastern societies, Western society places great importance on skill to value individuals. If you are skilled at sending a small ball into a hole with an iron stick, you receive glory and fortune. If you are skilled at driving a car at 400 kilometres per hour and winning a Grand Prix, you receive glory and fortune. If you are skilled with your feet**

and manage to place a ball into a net despite the fierce defence of opponents, you receive glory and fortune. If you are skilled with your tongue and speak better than others, you receive glory, fortune, and privileges. Finally, the skill considered most 'remarkable' by our contemporaries is that of amassing a huge fortune. The 'sharp business sense' is placed on a pedestal for valuing the Habilis. Accumulating vast wealth is undoubtedly the most prized dream of the Habilis.

The dominant criterion of appreciation for many remains skill, not wisdom. The Sapiens tendency is of little importance. The respect for grey-haired heads does not exist in Western society. Only Far Eastern cultures value wisdom and old age.

The authorities of the current humanity are mostly skilful individuals, manipulators with Habilis Sapiens aptitudes.

The masses progress at their snail's pace toward acquiring a greater proportion of the Sapiens tendency. A growing number of exceptional individuals are already asserting themselves as full-fledged Aquarian beings, entering into the metamorphosis of Galactica. Each fruit ripens in its time, and nothing is more indigestible than a green fruit. Nature takes its time and has infinite patience.

****Let's make a remark here on the choice of the name Galactica. We could have chosen Homo Beati (happy) but this term is very limited, even if optimists think that the human race of tomorrow will achieve permanent happiness. We could have chosen Homo Omnium (universal), but the universe is too vast, and we do not yet know where the place of humanity lies within it. We could have chosen Homo Conscientia (conscious), but we will see in the next chapters why this designation is limiting.**

**** You will find the reasons for choosing the name Galactica in the next chapters.**

A) But what exactly is this Aquarian era?

The Mesopotamians and Egyptians developed a particular interest in studying the celestial vault. They discovered that the stars were grouped into certain constellations to which they assigned names of symbols or animals. Thus, the signs of the zodiac were born. Then, they observed that the sun 'rose' on the morning of the spring equinox in a particular zodiacal constellation. They discovered that the sun 'moved' extremely slowly from one constellation to another, and calculated that the passage between two constellations lasted about 2160 years.

There are 12 signs in the Zodiac, and the complete cycle takes 25,900 years. The Egyptians left us eloquent vestiges of zodiacal eras through

their sculptures of Apis (Age of Taurus) but t also the avenues of certain temples lined with stone rams (Age of Aries)

Alexander the Great lived shortly before the end of the Age of Aries, and some coins, such as that of Lysimachus, depict the illustrious conqueror with the ram's horns of Jupiter Ammon.

Some astrologers say that the Age of Aquarius began in 1962 when the planets Mercury, Venus, Mars, Jupiter, and Saturn, as well as the Sun, Earth, and Moon, were all in the constellation of Aquarius.

Let's take a look at the last three ages mentioned by astrology and their impact on human societies: Taurus, Pisces, and Aquarius.

The Age of Taurus occurred between 4500 and 2320 B.C. This was the era of the glorification of Apis and the Bulls in Egypt. It was followed by the Age of Aries, which was a glorious era for Egypt (let's remember Amenhotep, Nefertiti, Tutankhamun, Ramses, and many others). The end of this era saw the empire invaded by the Hittite hordes, then the armies of Alexander the Great, and finally the armies of Caesar and Antony (the tragic end of Cleopatra, the last pharaoh). The Age of Aries was also glorious for ancient Greece and Rome.

Astrologers describe those born under the sign of Aries as individuals overflowing with energy, brave, loving popularity, and being the centre of attention. This sign is under the influence of Mars (the god of war). In the 'battles' of life, they achieve glory through struggle, overcoming difficulties with their courage and self-confidence. A typical 'modern' Aries was Bismarck, a dominating, autocratic, and fearless leader. Any attempt to control or repudiate a leader born under Aries is often met with violent opposition and great anger.

Simply reading the historical epics of the centuries preceding the Age of Pisces reveals many examples of the characteristics previously mentioned. The Ram was often depicted in history during this time, either in the form of statues or as the lamb (let's remember the sacrifices and the Divine Lamb).

The Age of **Pisces** is represented by the symbol of two fish tied together, facing opposite directions. It began shortly before the advent of Christianity. The Bible is particularly eloquent about the fact that the world was awaiting new times...

The symbol of the two fish explains the duality and the struggle between opposites. Indeed, it was an era of conflicts between human groups (opposing ideologies). It was also the era of the major influence of dogmas, blind faith, inquisitions, hierarchies, authorities, and patriotism.

This era saw institutionalized religions build considerable influence over society and culture. The being of the Age of Pisces had a strong need to worship, beg, pray, and believe in some form of supreme authority, in the absolute control of each individual's destiny. But it was also a philanthropic era, one of self-sacrifice, volunteerism, excessive evangelization, and altruism.

Astrologers tell us that a Pisces person is generally sensitive to the suffering of those close to them. They want to help. They are impressionable and express their sympathy, but they also need a lot of encouragement. Family takes the first place in their priorities. They love comfort and a peaceful life. They seek order and social organization but do not like to make decisions, relying on others, stronger than themselves, to lead and make major decisions. This is the source of the manipulations carried out by bands of ambitious, political, or religious crooks.

This sign is strongly attracted to occult forces, at the risk of being entirely controlled by superstition. They are extreme in their emotions, romantic and generous, but they do not have a strong will. They need regular praise to rise to a high position because they are not ambitious. It is true that the numerous hierarchies that surrounded them were a brake on their ability to think freely (which suited Pisces). Force was often used to compel the precursor individual of Aquarius to remain at the heart of the flock. Those who sought to escape it paid with their lives. Pisces seems to have built its own shackles through its own weaknesses.

Let us not forget that an era never ends abruptly to be replaced by another. Many individuals remain strongly influenced by the traits of the previous era, even several centuries into the new era. The transition is slow, gradual, but inevitable.

The 'Pisces' type individual believes that their fundamental value depends on things or people external to themselves. Take away those things or people, and they are lost, anxious, furious, or dangerous. This characteristic remains extremely powerful at the beginning of the 21st century.

If the possession of advantageous physical attributes often makes them believe it determines an individual's worth, the possession of goods or titles is another. Does society not teach us to bow to Mr. President, Mr. Mayor, Mr. CEO, the minister, the millionaire based on their titles, medals, or millions? It never gives us the opportunity to delve into what really makes the greatness (or smallness) of these authorities. Those who run society naturally have a considerable advantage in maintaining this state of affairs.

The Age of Pisces is also characterized by the way authorities dictate to individuals how to live their lives, what rules to follow, what principles to

observe, what commandments to obey, which vaccines to receive, or for whom to vote.

We cannot cite a better example than that of certain devotees who told us, after the referendum on Europe: 'We were told to vote against it!'

Created by the ego and for the ego, hierarchies are the direct consequence of the diversity of human capacities. Since humans discovered that they can be more cunning, more ambitious, and more skilful, they began to manipulate their fellow humans to control and exploit them.

If this differentiation first asserted itself with physical strength, as in animal species, it shifted in human due to cerebral dispositions that vary greatly from one person to another. Initially, the brute imposed their strength to rise to the top of the group's hierarchy. Then, the cunning used the brutes to reach the top of the hierarchy themselves.

Creating hierarchies of social structures led to a range of other hierarchical ideas, including that of the afterlife. This has become a deeply embedded archetype in the psyche, an archetype that most still accept today as reality.

The West has hierarchized its temporal powers (see all the titles among aristocrats, all the ranks among the military, all the functions in administration) and its spiritual powers (as we have already mentioned).

The Far East also structured its temporal powers but did not do the same with the spiritual. Instead, it sought to hierarchize the deep nature of the individual. Thus, we find there a complex set of levels or degrees of consciousness development. There is the Self (body) and the Higher Self (soul), and between them, hierarchies of levels that present at the base, the physical plane, then the emotional, mental, Buddhist, atmic, monadic planes, and at the very top, the Adi plane. The caste system is part of this.

These ideas of ranks come from the original archetype of seeking the favours of the dominant male of the early hominids.

We have a very significant expression of the hierarchical influence so valued by the being of the Pisces era. Those who are members of a congregation or group say, for example: 'I belong to a group of...'

'Belong' implies a very strong sense of fitting. This verb tends to signify that we have chosen to give up, or renounce, our freedom of thought, and that we place ourselves entirely under the power of an institution that will think for us and dictate the conduct to adopt.

'I belong to such and such Church' indirectly means: 'I am one of their possessions.' This clearly reflects the Pisces era, which cannot function without authority, guidance, a director of conscience, or a guru.

The naivety of humanity in the Pisces era, its lack of firmness, and its limited consciousness of Habilis, barely Sapiens, have allowed ambitious or megalomaniac individuals to reach the top of hierarchies and assert themselves as more equal than others. They reinforced the concept of the fragmentation of human society by favouring increasingly complex military, political, or religious hierarchies.

It can therefore be said that the peoples of the Pisces era had the leaders who took advantage of their weaknesses. In other words, it is the typical attributes and defects of the Pisces era that allowed the emergence of the systems and institutions of the last millennia. A slow maturation and an awakening of consciousness through education are at the source of the revolutionary explosions of past centuries.

'Without hierarchies, human society would fall into absolute chaos,' claims authority. This is true for a society dominated by Habilis Sapiens, but it no longer applies when the majority becomes truly Sapiens-Sapiens, on the way to transforming into beings of Aquarius.

The society at the end of the Pisces era pushes the individual towards a frantic race for titles, fortune, success, beauty, possession of goods, and knowledge. These individuals are influenced to believe from early childhood that their valuation depends on this. Thus, goes the consumer society. 'Consume to be valued.'

In reality, this means: 'Consume and you will be convinced that your personal worth is relative to the possession of something, convinced that value is not in the heart but in objects.'

Remove all wealth, goods, pleasures, titles, distractions, knowledge, and 90% of humanity will lose its compass. For these individuals, the compass is in the sense of self, not in compassion, humility, love, and giving. Their dissatisfaction is cyclical because any possession satisfies only for a limited time.

**

The essence of religious acts until the advent of the age of Aquarius can be summarized in these words: 'Worship Strength.' We find in it the archetype of fear that has transformed into superstition, these two ingredients that have motivated most of the choices and decisions made by our ancestor, since his transformation from Habilis-Erectus to homo Sapiens.

The transition from Erectus-Habilis to Sapiens was a long and painful birth that spanned millennia. The apex of this transformation was the violent destruction, the carnage of more than 100 million human beings during the 20th century. Instincts uncontrolled by social law but by the law of the strongest, repressed into anxious unconscious minds, exploded into murderous madness during multiple wars and genocides. Then the Sapiens-Sapiens awakened, and suddenly realized that genetic instinct left to itself is capable of creating hell on Earth. Humanity questioned itself seriously. The collective unconscious benefited from an almost global awakening.

‘Worship Strength’ means adopting hierarchies and social differences, strengthening inequality among human beings. At the top is the Creative Force, and at the bottom, the Destructive Force, the Force of Evil, Beelzebub. In between? Naturally, a whole range of values decided by men who were born more equal than others: status, wealth, deceit, brute force, beauty, privileges, skills, in short, everything that feeds the ego.

But, by extension, it also means adhering to the belief that the social state is entirely mirrored in the heavens. The ancient Egyptians believed this, and their temples prove how much they worshiped strength.

It was essentially to safeguard their privileges that the authorities of the Pisces era were often as rigid as a bishop's crook and as intolerant as inquisitors. They spoke the monologue of dogmas.

It can be predicted that in the coming decades, beings with strong Habilis and Pisces tendencies will resist any change that displeases them. We regularly witness their destabilization attempts orchestrated by a mafia of arms dealers. The explosions of hatred resulting from the collision of these various fundamentalisms are absolutely predictable.

Isn't it essentially the Habilis persons of the Pisces era who orchestrated the Inquisitions, genocides, and all the excesses of intolerance on the globe over the last two millennia? Intolerance was not on the agenda during the Aries and Taurus Eras. Egyptians accepted that foreigners worship their own gods in Egypt.

Marxist Communism quickly erected itself into a fundamentalist movement that clearly belongs to the Pisces era. Fundamentalism can be as much atheist as religious when divine authority is replaced by the State, personified by a supreme dictator.

The Habilis being of the Pisces era has institutionalised his spirituality into religion. He has sought to convert peoples to his beliefs because he firmly believes he possesses the only truth. He has endeavoured to impose it on others, by force if necessary. Now, he proudly rides a Harley-Davidson wearing a leather jacket that reads: 'Soldier of Christ.' He needs authorities: God, the father, the king, the president, the general... He needs to be guided and to follow orders because the conviction of his dependence and futility remains an obstacle to his self-worth. He needs to believe in beings 'superior' to himself. He remains convinced that his worth depends on his servitude to authority, on the consideration, titles, and privileges offered to him by his political or religious leaders.

Science has proven that throughout millions of years of evolution, only the creatures capable of adapting and changing quickly reproduced successfully and survived natural selection. All others disappeared. The being of the Aquarius era is well aware of this. He adopts change not as a necessary evil but as an absolute necessity. He knows that cultural modifications are the result of the evolution of the human species. While instincts, genes, and their selfish aspirations dominated the actions of Australopithecus and then those of Erectus-Habilis, culture has since influenced the evolution of Sapiens-Sapiens. By globalising over the next few centuries, its influence will help ease many conflicts despite the fierce pockets of fundamentalist resistance.

The Pisces person wants to impose his doctrines, beliefs, but also his culture on others. The Crusades, the Inquisitions, and colonialism have long ended, but that does not prevent commercial colonisation. We encounter entrepreneurs seeking to impose around the world The American Way of Life, The American Culture, Chinese products, or those who want the planet to eat Kentucky or drink Cola.

Political strategists of the Pisces type from 'democratic' countries must imperatively seek to manipulate the electorate to guarantee the re-election of the party in power. A recent example is given below.

"...The primary objective of the invasion (of Iraq) was to ensure George W. Bush's re-election in 2004," writes Bob Woodward - State of Denial-published by Simon & Schuster.

Indeed, apart from fear, one of the most sensitive elements for electoral choice is employment. The 'democratic' election system (developed by the Pisces era!) is designed in such a way that it allows for the most ingenious manipulations by smooth talkers who are thirsty for power. In

this respect, the individual who fears losing his job is forced to accept certain manipulative pressures. We have recently seen the extreme pressure of the Covid 'vaccine' by many governments despite it going against the Nuremberg law imposing the fundamental respect of each individual's choice.

As W. Harman wrote in *Global Mind Change*: *"We discover a new perspective (of the problem) when we imagine what the consequences on unemployment rates in the United States would be if by some miracle, world peace was assured, and the portion of economic activity currently involved in national security was no longer required."*

This sheds new light on the creation of 'artificial' jobs in air transport security and others. One might also wonder what the real reasons are for the numerous conflicts in which the United States has 'intervened,' such as Vietnam, Korea, Afghanistan, Iraq and the two Gulf Wars. These conflicts benefit not only arms manufacturers and financial barons but also directly impact politics and the electorate. We can therefore ask two questions:

- * Does the manipulation of electoral masses go so far as to scheme conflicts to create or maintain artificial jobs in 'security'?
- * Should the foundations of the 'democratic' system be questioned in the Aquarian age if we desire to ensure lasting world peace?

Moreover, the 'War Budget' of the American government (now the 'National Security Budget'...) amounts to billions of dollars ... Adding those of France, Great Britain, Russia, China, and Israel, we reach the colossal sum of more than one trillion dollars per year! This shows how much fear manipulates the homo Habilis of the 21st century!

Why does the Pisces allow their politicians to spend so much money on activities that do not develop the deep potential of the human being? Is it because they are manipulated by fear through medias? Is it for the illusion of national security? For the enormous profits of a clique? To believe they are safe from North Koreans or Martians? To perpetuate the fortune of the arms industry? To continue creating 'artificial' jobs and ensure victory in elections?

But who pays for the mad arms race? You and I, of course. Do you feel any safer? Isn't it said that the world has become increasingly dangerous for the average person! Where is the logic behind these absurd numbers?

Imagine what a trillion dollars could do for our planet if humanity lived in peace. With 3 billion dollars per year, it is possible to eradicate all tropical diseases that afflict the Developing World terribly. With a trillion dollars, within less than five years, the poor would have enough to eat, and the health and education of all children would be guaranteed. The 'developing countries' would then be much less inclined to fall into the throes of religious fundamentalism and overpopulation. Freed from poverty, developing countries would produce fewer children, quickly solving the overpopulation problem. Massive education would, within a generation, see the emergence of thousands of talented, intelligent individuals who have so far been unable to contribute to the increase of global intellectual potential. What new discoveries and progress would emerge?

We are now witnessing the growth of this phenomenon in India and China. Global awareness would benefit from a full acceleration of common progress and the reduction of risks of conflict. A trillion dollars would then allow humanity to solve once and for all (in less than a generation) the ecological problems and global warming. Within three generations, we could transition from Homo Sapiens-Sapiens to Homo Galactica if humanity wanted to. Utopia? Of course, this is a utopia for you who are an Erectus-Habilis of the Pisces era!

The leaders chosen by the Habilis-Pisces think only about one thing: preserving hierarchies, nationalism, and perpetuating fear and the idea of having to defend against an ever-present enemy. (Isn't it easy to create new enemies!!) By constantly seeking to strengthen national security, they only reinforce nationalism and separation, which greatly pleases the ego.

The leaders are too often men dominated by an ego that cares nothing about the wisdom potential of the people. They think they know what the people need and seek to impose their opinions, their points of view. They resist change that could threaten their privileges and hierarchical systems. But we have chosen them, even through abstention, haven't we?

The question is whether the human masses entering the Aquarian age will continue to be manipulated by these 'authorities' and their sponsors or if they want to offer their children a life of peace, progress, and harmonious prosperity. If so, they have only one option: abolish systems that favour the ego and promote honest exchange, communication, and global harmony at all times. Too difficult or utopian, no doubt?

It is said that the example comes from the top. As long as the top is full of self-importance and steeped in hypocrisy, others only follow its example (or its directives?). If it used its authority to promote respectful

communication (instead of imposing its views), to open doors and initiate the transformation of humanity, the United States would be remembered in the history books of the next millennium, not as a decadent Rome, but as an extraordinary leader who orchestrated global transformation.

And the arms merchants, then, will they be the big losers? Don't they have a major interest in stirring up conflicts?

Certainly, yes, if they are dominated by the 'Habilis' tendency, they will be eager to pursue their destructive activities. But as for those who become Sapiens-Sapiens, although subject to the fear that has traditionally maintained the status quo of nationalisms, they too could transform themselves, make just as much money, by participating in the development of humanity or investing in new technologies capable of developing the spaceships of the future. Aberration? Absurdity?

It is true that it is easier to make cannons than a space rocket, but when one has access to money, one employs the brains that can design the rocket and all the necessary technology.

**

The people of the Pisces era strongly believe in separation. They do not conceive that there could be invisible links between all forms of life. They have been taught to believe in an individual soul that will remain as such for eternity. The soul, for them, is the mirror image of the body, and the celestial hierarchy is the mirror image of the hierarchy down here.

Christianity taught the resurrection of bodies and the Last Judgment. Reward and punishment are the basis of its social order and concept of divine order. A visit to Westminster Chapel in London offers a brilliant demonstration of this idea of retribution. One discovers there that military honours, medals, acclamations, titles, and privileges rewarded those who fought for the glory of their homeland, their king, and their God.

The beliefs in reincarnation and Karma are themselves strongly influenced by this principle of retribution. A next life of comfort in a high caste or miserable in that of the untouchables? Each is free to decide during this life, and if they were born untouchable, it's their fault!

****But where does the psychological structure of the Pisces being come from?** How has humanity reached its current level of consciousness?

The slow evolution of human consciousness, over the six million years that have shaped it, has been built on the growth of the brain, mental faculties, and instincts specific to hominids. By leaving the forest and coming down from the trees, each group had to ensure the protection of a powerful male. Survival in the savanna depended on strength, agility, and cunning.

Among monkeys, females and young must rely on the protection of the strongest male, who has the right to mate, the privilege of covering the females in the group to perpetuate his genes. Our Erectus, Habilis, then Sapiens ancestors built their groups and tribes on this innate need for protection. It was vital to have the protection of a powerful male to survive against attacks from belligerent groups or young males seeking power and coveting females. We will see in a future chapter how this fundamental need contributed to developing a patriarchal society.

With the advent of agriculture, some groups discovered grain surpluses. This surplus became a currency of exchange to acquire workers who could also serve as soldiers. The desire for power and the surplus of harvests are therefore, in a way, the roots of aristocracies. Initially, ruffians may have tried to seize grain or livestock. Then small bandit leaders employed these rogues to seize land, goods, or women. Conflicts or sporadic incursions to expand their domains over the centuries grew more intense, eventually becoming increasingly deadly struggles.

The individual no longer had to protect himself from wild animals but from his own increasingly greedy, cruel, and dangerous species. This resulted in a greater need for protectors. The aristocracy of the sword offered its protection but often at the cost of freedom. The defeated captive was sacrificed to the gods in some regions of the world or became a slave. The women and daughters of the vanquished were one of the spoils of conquest.

But the powerful remained very superstitious and called upon mages to read the stars and predict their future. In Egypt and Mesopotamia, the mages became a priest. With Christianity, the priest replaced the mages.

In ancient civilizations, the priest-magus and his clergy first served the kings. Later, declaring themselves protectors of souls, they sought the kings' favour and endeavoured to control their excesses. They imposed the 'laws of the gods' on the king and the people. Body and soul then became subjected to two aristocracies born of the surplus of harvests and primary instinct!

The individual lost the freedom his group had gained when he was a hunter. He now had to fight for his king and his faith. His wife bore future warriors and taught her children to obey, to fight fiercely against 'the enemy and the infidel,' and to die for the glory of the king, the country, or the gods. The authorities then invented medals and titles for those who helped them protect their privileges. Honour became fashionable. The honour of the family, the clan, the group, then the country or race acquired such importance that it led to a new concept: nationalism. The small raids gradually transformed into increasingly deadly quarrels and organized battles.

Some tried to avoid recruitment. But their father reminded them that authority must be obeyed. Despite everything, they remained servants, constrained and dependent. When a revolt managed to oust a Prince, he was quickly replaced by another. One could not live without leaders, without authority.

The true liberation of the human being began with the contribution of scientific discoveries. A major transformation occurred with the invention of the printing press, which opened the door to mass education. Books opened new horizons, expanded knowledge, and the curious mind began to question authority.

After Descartes, a growing number of thinkers and scientists distanced themselves from institutionalized religion, without losing the intuition of a creative intelligence. The man-made God they were offered was too limited. It reflected the control from ecclesiastical authorities. The God of the Bible, endowed with human attributes such as anger, jealousy, segregation, and injustice didn't make sense. With these thinkers, God moved away from superstition and into reason. They broadened the concept of the Supreme Being beyond altars and dogmas.

In our time, various Christian renewal movements, the 'new-born' movements, have selected the attribute of the Son of God that appeals to them: Love (though they do not dare declare it unconditional). In this subtle rejection of the Father's authority to replace it with love lies one of the characteristic traits of the new Age of Aquarius. A wave of Christian renewal emerged from this concept through multiple predominantly Anglo-Saxon sects. Rome began to listen after noticing the growing loss of priestly vocations and disciples in the Western world. It discreetly reversed course before taking a new direction.

'Since the people desire a God of love, let's give them a God of love. Let's give them the Son, the Christ, the Redeemer whose love is infinite. Let's also give them His mother, the one who gave birth and suffered!'

This created a resurgence of religious fervour in the last century, and the missionary faith of some young people who had the 'choice' between the Love of Christ or the Free Love of the Hippies.

What appeals with 'Jesus loves you' is essentially an emotional balm. The great preachers of Christ's love achieve astonishing success among those who suffer from a lack of emotional validation. American evangelical television networks amply demonstrate this phenomenon, which often leans towards commercial activity. It's not only psychologists who can heal wounded emotions.

If marketing and modern media manage to manipulate people even better than the Church once did, some question the motivations of these institutions. Are they patiently waiting for a new source, a spirituality that combines scientific knowledge, reason, observation, logic with intuition? Failing to find the path, they ride freely through the seasons, knowing that the quality of the journey is more important than the destination.

While for the follower of dogmas, everything must be undertaken to ensure a glorious destination for the soul, (the mirror of the ego), the Aquarian gradually perceives that the answer to the mystery of life might lie in the very act of living. For them, life would be neither orchestrated by systems of rewards nor by promotions in successive reincarnations. It is an experience, an expression, a play, a comedy. This changes everything.

b) Brief characteristics of the person of the Age of Aquarius

"The enlightened state, friend of enlightenment, does nothing by the people, but everything for the people."

Charles d'Yderwalle*

After the revolutions that bloodied the last centuries in the West, new authorities have strived to offer rights to the people, this dormant volcano capable of suddenly awakening and overturning everything. Even today, they fail to distinguish between the people and the individual. The leaders at the end of the Piscean Era insist that they "derive their power from the people, not the individual." A subtle distinction!

But towards the end of the Piscean Era, more and more individuals demand recognition, refusing to be seen as negligible entities. "Without the individual, there is no people," they insist. Are today's politicians

pretending not to hear? The revolutions of tomorrow will be at their expense.

For the being of the Aquarian Era, there will be no more titles, no more honour, no more hypocrisy in the guise of ermine robes, pomp for the glory of nationalism, gold to impress the masses, silver to corrupt the influential, or crumbs for the poor. These beings are gradually emerging across the world, but they do not yet display themselves. They are distinctly different from the masses and sometimes wonder if they are anomalies.

Astrologers describe Aquarian beings as independent, following their own intuitions and never losing hope. They are highly creative, social, and enjoy helping others. They are influenced by Saturn and Uranus. Saturn makes them cautious, dull, and indolent, but Uranus can suddenly transform them into geniuses ready to challenge the established order, destroy conventions and habits, and reveal remarkable feats of inspiration. More geniuses are found among Aquarians than in any other sign! They strive to seek truth, justice, and beauty, which drives them to dream of a fair world, distancing themselves from outdated ideas and concepts. They desire to change the world and replace old structures with those that benefit everyone.

They scrutinize every idea or concept through the sieve of logic before forming an opinion, which, once expressed, becomes unchangeable. They love new ideas but only accept them once satisfied they are applicable to the real world. Any invention or idea that can improve the world's condition will be embraced. They hate taking orders. Their inventive minds extend to all practical matters. They abhor the ordinary and are unpredictable. The being of the Aquarian Era is undoubtedly the torchbearer who will illuminate the future of humanity.

We are all descendants of survivors from a past of conflicts. Thus goes natural selection! The being of the Aquarian Era will be well aware of this. They will embrace change not as a necessary evil but as an absolute necessity. They understand that cultural mutations are powerful drivers of human evolution. In the beginning, instincts, genetic heritage, and tribal struggles dominated the behaviour of australopithecine hominids, then that of Homo Erectus-Habilis. Evolution then offered humans a brain with increasing capacities, enabling the construction of cultures capable of guiding the behaviour of Homo Sapiens-Sapiens.

Aquarius Traits:

“We have entered the Age of Aquarius—the water bearer—for which man must discover the truth for himself and exercise free thinking. A tremendous ideological change is taking place.”

We have seen that the Aquarian Era is under the influence of Uranus (the planet of transformations). It will be conducive to the synthesis of religious systems (depicted by the water symbol of the two mingling jugs) and to the realisation that matter and spirit originate from the same source. However, the full recognition of this era requires the education of each individual to eliminate fear and superstition.

The Aquarian being loves freedom and will seek to realize their potential. Consequently, this will be an era of innovation in all fields. It will be an era of change, understanding, growth in knowledge, and wisdom (the maturity of the Sapiens par excellence). It will be an era of information exchange that will help others realize their potential. Individual consciousness will soar to higher realms. Discoveries and achievements, entirely unimaginable at present, will result. This will be an era of new spirituality based on ideas currently inconceivable. For Aquarius, it is curiosity that shapes genius.

Aquarians will constantly reshape the rules of the game; they will change them as they mature and evolve. They will refuse to be confined within rigid principles, too narrow for their thirst for freedom, their desire to know and evolve. To realize their potential (which they will seek as it is their destiny), they will only be able to rely on themselves. Certainly, they will not neglect the knowledge acquired over millennia to extract their own creativity, truth, and valorisation.

In extension, the Homo Galactica (which Aquarius will slowly become) will never be a fixed being (as the Pisces were). Each new moment, each day, will offer them the stimulation of discoveries. They will constantly question and discover.

If Pisces fight against others to impose their strength, ideas, or beliefs, Aquarius will fight against himself in the continuous flow of experience. They will have no need to legitimise themselves or prove themselves to others. Aquarius will not judge others based on what they possess, their victories, or their talents. They will seek to understand others to discern their deep values. For them, the balance between intellectual, emotional, and spiritual quotients will represent the foundation of intrinsic values.

Aquarius will not seek to associate with nationalism, a sports club, a race, an army, or a belief to climb a ladder of power or to validate themselves. They will not solicit gurus, priests, bosses, or any authority to

guide them. Certainly, they will seek and accept advice but will question the validity of orders. They will listen but will not submit to any authority of power, knowing above all that any institution represents the sum of the egos of its members.

They will not seek to win, knowing that when there is a winner, there is always a loser. They will despise superiority because when there are superiors, there are also inferiors. They will explore exchange to better understand, play for the sake of playing, and engage in sports to excel against themselves. For them, success is only the beginning of a journey, not its end.

The Aquarian Era will transform humanity and prepare it for awakening toward a total metamorphosis. This transformation will first affect those who are curious and open to change, those who seek and no longer blindly quench their thirst from sacred books written by those who thought before them.

According to astrologer S. Durst, an individual's belonging to the Aquarian Era requires "an awareness and behaviour that recognises the deep truth of human equality." This awareness allows one to contemplate the intrinsic value of each individual beyond possessions and privileges.

The being of the Aquarian Era will have no regard for hierarchies. They will ask authority: "Beyond your titles and possessions, who are you? What is your deep value, that which distinguishes the ego from the consciousness of being? What will you take with you when you have lost everything your ego clung to during its life?"

For the Aquarius, accepting to submit to any form of authority is to renounce freedom. The being of Aquarius knows that as long as hierarchies (so prized by their predecessor) exist, there is neither equality nor fraternity. Hierarchy is a blatant demonstration that the law is not the same for everyone and that the higher one climbs the ladder, the more privileges one acquires.

I was in New Caledonia a few years ago when a young policeman, fresh from the metropolis, issued a fine to the wife of a nickel baron for some traffic violation. Our officer was full of enthusiasm and intended to apply the same law to everyone. A few days later, he was summoned by the authorities, received verbal reprimands for his "inappropriate" action, and was sent to a menial post for the remainder of his contract.

Similar examples are present in most of our memories. The way the law is applied remains the privilege of the strongest or the richest. Moreover, this fosters corruption.

The Aquarian will become increasingly aware of this mind-set, so typical of Erectus-Habilis (those with "connections" are skilful at getting their fines cancelled) and will strive to create structures that will replace hierarchies. Several millennia may pass before any form of hierarchy disappears from the planet. It all depends on the awakening of the masses.

Yes, let us repeat, the Aquarian Era is underway and will overturn everything, even if the majority is apathetic, complacent in ignorance, and still entangled in the Piscean desire to accumulate.

An increasing number of people already display a refusal to depend, an obstinacy to be valued and accepted, a refusal to obey blindly. These forerunners prefer to separate themselves from the crumbling structures and know that it is possible to walk freely. They refuse to be insignificant 'insects' subjected to all kinds of authorities and hierarchies (divine, ecclesiastical, paternal, familial, aristocratic, military, political, unionist, employer, etc.). For them, nothing is predetermined; everything is possible.

When one disagrees with a system, one leaves it. Gradually, they will transition from being seen as "eccentrics" to "curiosities" before their value, individuality, talents, and intelligence are recognised. They will teach by their actions that no one is superior and that no one has the right to dictate others' destinies. They will prove that it is possible to live independently, that it is possible to educate children without imposing blind obedience, dogma, guilt, or fear. They will not be dreamers or utopians but realists in their respect for every other human being, every other form of life, a respect due to the variety and importance that each acquires within the flow of evolution.

They will question life and death based on an unexpected platform. They will leave their bell tower, their village, their city, or their country to become citizens of the planet, without borders, without separation. Look around you! You will discover more and more of them!

The new Age of Aquarius will completely revolutionize the political life of nations. The Aquarian being will no longer blindly accept the law that favours the powerful. Curious, isn't it? Yes, very curious and impossible if you think like a Habilis-Pisces.

The individual will fully belong to the Age of Aquarius only when they have surpassed the limits imposed by the principle of retribution and judgment. The Aquarian will be deeply aware that the only thing the ego

possesses is the desire to possess, and that attachment to possessions is futile, serving only to satisfy the need for security and ambition.

The Aquarian will learn to know and control their primary instincts. They will consciously call upon cultural and spiritual values to control these instincts. They will be an awakened consciousness that knows it possesses unlimited potential.

The challenge posed to the being of the Age of Aquarius will be to be good for the sole reason of being good, and not out of fear of God, Allah, Jehovah, hell, Karma, or prison. They will no longer be detached from nature and will respect all forms of life due to the awareness of their connection with Creative Intelligence. They will venture deep into the knowledge of their time and will be continually amazed by the mysteries of the infinitely small and the infinitely large.

In this sense, the Aquarian truly belongs to their time because the beginning of their era, the end of the 20th century, was the starting point for the application of extraordinary scientific discoveries. While some believed they had reached the end of discoveries, science has proven that everything remains to be discovered in all fields. The Aquarian will become increasingly aware that this is the very consequence of the perpetual evolution of the material world and the world of consciousness. The mutation of humans, nature, and the cosmos is the uninterrupted expression of Creative Intelligence.

We will return to this point.

The Aquarian recognizes that the world consists of two forces that constantly oppose each other but also seek to balance each other. Opposing aspects could not exist alone, just as day could not exist without night. The Aquarian knows that tendencies toward good and evil are present in every person. This is what was called "the devil simmering in the heart of man," the shadow that Carl Jung spoke of, that dark part of each individual that the poet R. Bly referred to as "the big bag we drag behind us."

The Aquarian will no longer be blindly subject to these forces. They will become aware of their existence within themselves, knowing that understanding the process that creates the 'self' allows one to be liberated from it.

Two exceptional sages introduced the Age of Aquarius. They are the Indian thinker J. Krishnamurti and the Irish esoteric writer Terence Gray, whose pen name was "Wei Wu Wei." Most people never heard of either of them. This is not surprising, as these two sages are pioneers, and it will likely take one or two centuries for humanity to grasp the full extent of their

teachings. It is extraordinary that both were born in 1895 and died in 1986, at the end of the Age of Pisces! It seems they never met.
